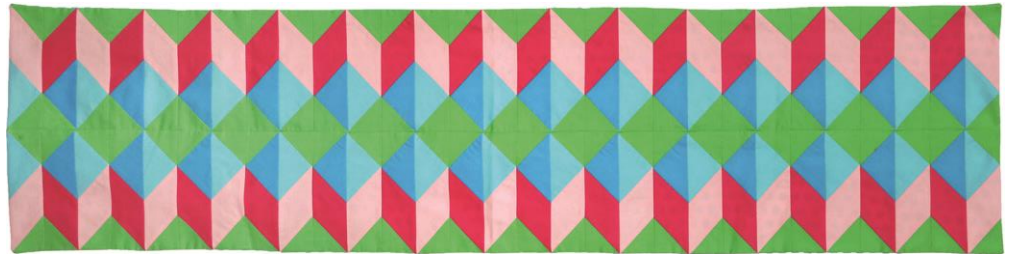


## GO! Star Parts Scarf

Finished Size 12¾" x 54¾"



Fabrics are Soho Solids provided by Timeless Treasures

Patches from GO! LeMoyne Star-9" Finished) (55453) are rearranged to create this colorful scarf. Careful color placement adds a dimensional effect. Two basic blocks create each scarf row. Each block uses the same patches, but patches are placed in a mirrored position to create the dimensional effect.

### GO!® Dies Used, Number of Shapes to Cut & Fabric Requirements

Note: Yardages are based on "rough-cuts" of 3" x 5½" rectangles for A triangles, 3¾" x 6¾" rectangles for B triangles and 5½" x 5¾" rectangles for C diamonds.

Green		GO! LeMoyne Star-9" Finished (55453)	Cut five 5½" x WOF strips. Sub cut 58—3" x 5½" rectangles. Cut 116—small A triangles from the rectangles.	7/8 yard
Pink		GO! LeMoyne Star-9" Finished (55453)	Cut three 5¾" x WOF strips. Sub cut 15—5¾" x 5½" rectangles. Cut 30 large C diamonds from the rectangles.	5/8 yard
Dark Pink		GO! LeMoyne Star-9" Finished (55453)	Cut three 5¾" x WOF strips. Sub cut 14—5¾" x 5½" rectangles. Cut 28 large C diamonds from the rectangles.	5/8 yard
Light Blue		GO! LeMoyne Star-9" Finished (55453)	Cut two 6¾" x WOF strips. Sub cut 15—3¾" x 6¾" rectangles. Cut 30 large B triangles from the rectangles.	1/2 yard
Dark Blue		GO! LeMoyne Star-9" Finished (55453)	Cut two 6¾" x WOF strips. Sub cut 14—3¾" x 6¾" rectangles. Cut 28 large B triangles from the rectangles.	1/4 yard of each color

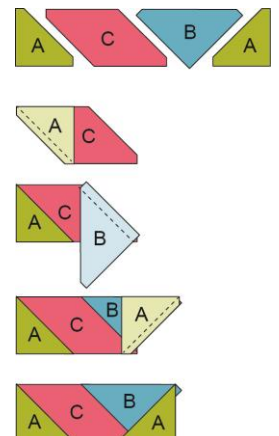
### Additional Fabrics Needed

- Scarf Backing—1 yard
  - Cut into 2 equal WOF strips.

### Sewing Directions

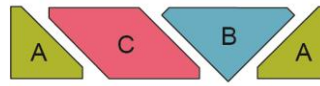
Note: Press all seams open and use a ¼" seam allowance unless otherwise indicated.

OPTIONAL TIP: To make the scarf units, the A, B, and C patches are arranged differently than the traditional LeMoyne Star block. As shown in the illustration, the A/C patches align perfectly along the adjacent seam. The B triangle must be centered along the C diamond's adjacent edge. The final A triangle aligns along the angled seam and one blunted point.



1. Lay out two green A triangles, one light pink C diamond, and one light blue B triangle as shown in Diagram 1. Sew the shapes together along adjacent edges. Make 15 light pink left-hand units.
2. Repeat step 1, using two green A triangles, one dark pink C diamond, and one dark blue B triangle as shown in Diagram 2. Make 14 dark pink right-hand units.
3. Lay out two green A triangles, one light blue B triangle, and one light pink C diamond as shown in Diagram 3. Sew the shapes together along adjacent edges. Make 15 light pink right-hand units.
4. Repeat step 3, using two green A triangles, one *dark* blue B triangle, and one *dark* pink C diamond as shown in Diagram 4. Make 14 dark pink left-hand units.
5. Referring to the Scarf Assembly Diagram, lay out the left and right hand units into two vertical rows of 29 units each. Note that you'll need to rotate the dark units.
6. Sew the units in each row together along adjacent edges.
7. Sew the two rows together.

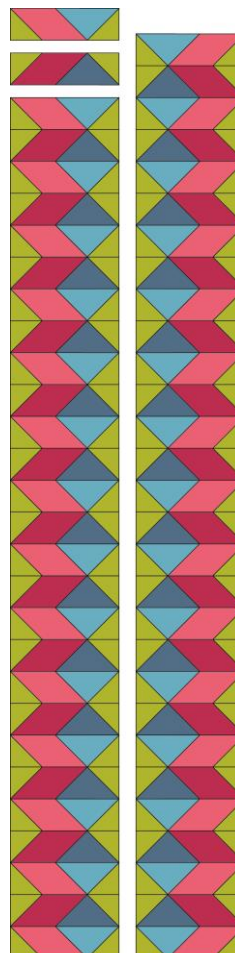

## Finishing

1. Join the backing strips together along one short end.
2. Place the scarf and backing right sides together, making sure to smooth out any folds or wrinkles. Pin the scarf and backing together around the scarf's outer edges. Stitch around the perimeter of the scarf, using a 1/4" seam allowance. Leave a 4" opening for turning.
3. Trim the excess backing and clip the corners. Turn the scarf right side out through the 4" opening. Use a point turner to smooth the seams and corners. Press the turned seam, tucking the seam allowance to the inside at the opening. Hand stitch the opening closed.
4. Optional--Add a few lines of hand or machine stitching to secure the backing and scarf together.
