- GO! Quarter Square-4" Finished Triangle (55047 or 55316)
- GO! Square-3¼" (55317)
- GO! Parallelogram-2¾"W x 2½"H (55318)
- GO! Strip Cutter-2½" (55014 or 55017)

FABRIC REQUIREMENTS

- Fabric 1—1 yard
- Fabric 2—¼ yard or fat quarter
- Fabric 3—½ yard
- Fabric 4—¼ yard or fat quarter
- Fabric 5—⅞ yard
- Fabric 6—⅔ yard
- Fabric 7—½ yard
- Fabric 8—¾ yard
- Backing—3 yards
- Batting—53" x 53"

CUTTING DIRECTIONS

Follow cutting directions in chart for Fabrics 1 through 7. Cut larger pieces before cutting smaller shapes.



Fabric 8:

- Cut 2—12⅝" squares
Sub cut diagonally twice
- Cut 4—8½" squares
- Cut 2—6⅝" squares
Sub cut diagonally once

* Lay 2½" strips across 4½" square on GO! Value Die to cut 2½" x 4½" rectangles.

** Rotary cut 8½" strip across width of fabric. Lay strip across GO! Strip Cutter-2½" to cut 2½" x 8½" strips.

SEWING DIRECTIONS

NOTE: Press seams toward the darker fabric or for the least bulk.

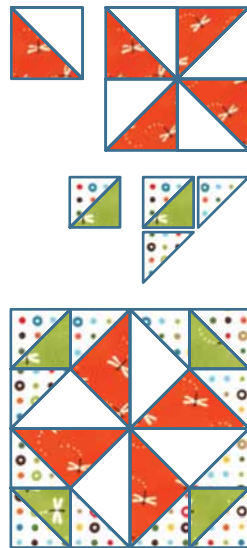
Block 1:

1. Make four 2" finished half square triangle units using Fabric #1 and #3.
2. Pin and sew one Fabric #4 and one #7, 2" finished half square triangle together as shown. Make four combined triangles.
3. Lay out pieces for Block 1 as shown. (Use four Fabric #2, 4" finished quarter square triangles and four Fabric #3 parallelograms)
4. Pin and sew one Fabric #3 parallelogram to combined triangle unit. Stop sewing $\frac{1}{4}$ " from outer point as shown by arrow. Reinforce stitching at stopping point. Make four combined units. Press seams toward parallelograms.
5. Inset half square triangles as shown. Make four combined units.
6. Pin and sew to form a star with eight sections. Press seams in clockwise direction pin wheeling intersection.
7. Inset Fabric #2, 4" finished quarter square triangles to complete block. Press seams to create the least bulk.



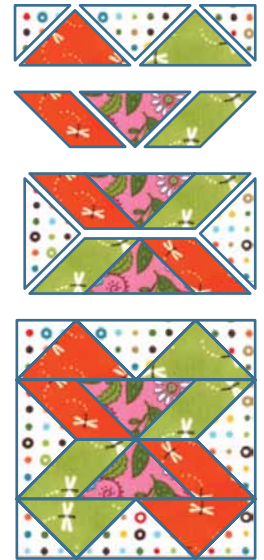
Block 2:

1. Make four half square triangle units using one Fabric #1 and one #3, 4" finished quarter square triangle.
2. Pin and sew together into 4-Patch unit. Pin wheel intersection.
3. Make four 2" finished half square triangle units using Fabric #4 and #7.
4. Pin and sew one Fabric #7, 2" finished half square triangle to side and bottom of 2" finished half square triangle unit as shown. Make four combined triangle units.
5. Pin and sew one combined triangle unit to each side of block center to complete block. Press seams open.



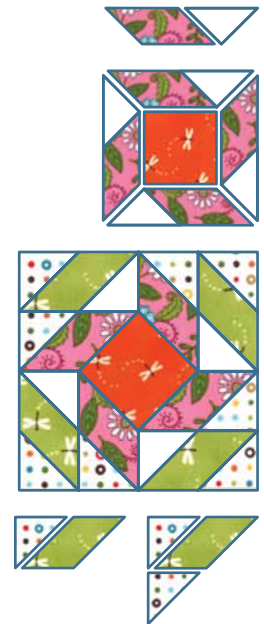
Block 3:

1. Pin and sew one Fabric #3, #4 and #7, 4" finished quarter square triangle together with two Fabric #7, 2" finished half square triangles as shown. Make two combined rows.
2. Pin and sew one Fabric #3 and Fabric #4 parallelogram to sides of Fabric #2, 4" finished quarter square triangle as shown. Make two.
3. Pin and sew combined units together stopping $\frac{1}{4}$ " from both ends of seam, reinforcing stitching. Press seam open.
4. Inset Fabric #7, 4" finished quarter square triangle as shown.
5. Pin and sew one pieced row from Step 1 to top and bottom of block center to complete block. Press seams open.



Block 4:

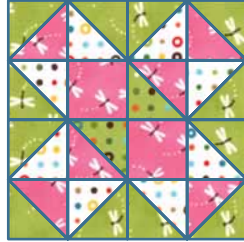
1. Pin and sew one Fabric #2 parallelogram and one Fabric #1, 2" finished half square triangle together as shown. Make four units. (Note: the cut off corner of the half square triangle will give the middle of the sewn edge a notched look.)
2. Mark $\frac{1}{4}$ " points on wrong side of Fabric #3, $3\frac{1}{4}$ " square.
3. Pin and sew one combined unit to each side of Fabric #3, $3\frac{1}{4}$ " square, sewing between the $\frac{1}{4}$ " points.
4. Pin and sew corner seams to complete block center. Press seams toward parallelograms.
5. Pin and sew one Fabric #7, 2" finished half square triangle to the side of one Fabric #4 parallelogram as shown.
6. Pin and sew one Fabric #7, 2" finished half square triangle to the bottom of combined unit. Make four corner units.
7. Pin and sew one corner unit to each side of block center to complete block. Press seams open.



SEWING DIRECTIONS Cont.

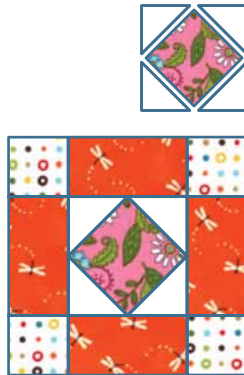
Block 5:

1. Make four 2" finished half square triangle units using Fabric #4 and #6.
2. Make eight 2" finished half square triangle units using Fabric #4 and #7.
3. Make two 2" finished half square triangle units using Fabric #5 and #6.
4. Lay out pieces for Block 5 as shown. (Use two Fabric #6, 2½" squares)
5. Pin and sew into rows. Press seams of each row in alternate directions.
6. Pin and sew rows together to complete block. Press seams open.



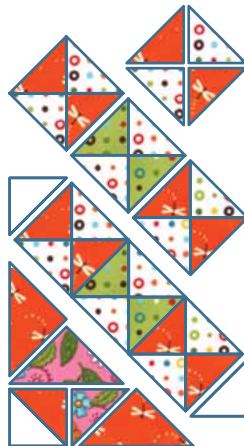
Block 6:

1. Pin and sew one Fabric #1, 2" finished half square triangle to each side of one Fabric #2, 3¼" square. Press seams toward triangles.
2. Pin and sew one Fabric #3, 2½" x 4½" rectangle to each side of block center. Press seams toward rectangles.
3. Pin and sew one Fabric #7, 2½" square to each end of one Fabric #3, 2½" x 4½" rectangle. Press seams toward rectangle. Make two rows.
4. Pin and sew rows together to complete block. Press seams toward outside edges of block.



Block 7:

1. Make two quarter square triangle units using two Fabric #3 and #7, 2" finished half square triangles as shown.
2. Make one quarter square triangle unit using two Fabric #5 and #7, 2" finished half square triangles as shown.
3. Pin and sew together to form center diagonal row unit.
4. Pin and sew one Fabric #1, 2" finished half square triangle to each end.
5. Make two 2" finished half square triangle units using Fabric #1 and #3.

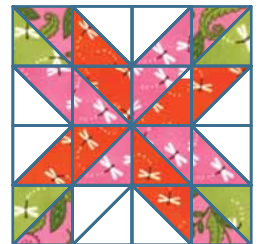


6. Lay out shapes for block corners as shown. (Use two Fabric #3, 4" finished quarter square triangles; one Fabric #2, 4" finished quarter square triangle and one Fabric #2, 2" finished half square triangle)
7. Pin and sew together. Make two corner units.
8. Pin and sew one corner unit to sides of block center to complete block. Press seams open.



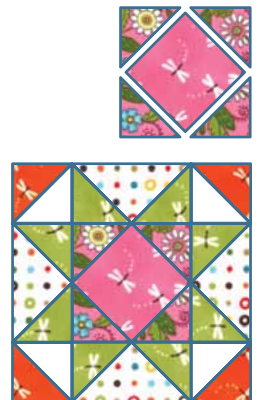
Block 8:

1. Make four 2" finished half square triangle units using Fabric #2 and #4.
2. Make four 2" finished half square triangle units using Fabric #1 and #3.
3. Make four 2" finished half square triangle units using Fabric #1 and #6.
4. Make four 2" finished half square triangle units using Fabric #3 and #6.
5. Lay out pieces for Block 8 as shown.
6. Pin and sew into rows. Press seams of each row in alternate directions.
7. Pin and sew rows together to complete block. Press seams open.



Block 9:

1. Make four 2" finished half square triangle units using Fabric #1 and #3.
2. Make four flying geese units using two Fabric #4, 2" finished half square triangles and one Fabric #7, 4" finished quarter square triangle.
3. Pin and sew one Fabric #2, 2" finished half square triangle to each side of one Fabric #6, 3¼" square. Press seams toward triangles.
4. Pin and sew one flying geese unit to each side of block center. Press seams open.
5. Pin and sew one 2" finished half square triangle unit to each side of two remaining flying geese units. Press seams open.
6. Pin and sew rows together to complete block. Press seams open.



SEWING DIRECTIONS Cont.

Quilt Center Construction:

1. Lay out pieced blocks, Fabric #1, 2½" x 8½" sashing strips and Fabric #5, 2½" squares following quilt diagram. Add Fabric #8, squares and triangles to quilt layout.
2. Pin and sew pieces together to form diagonal rows. Press seams toward sashing.
3. Pin and sew rows together to complete quilt center. Press seams toward sashing.
4. Pin and sew Fabric #6, 2½" border strips (piece strip as needed) to quilt center, sides first then top and bottom. Press seams toward border.

QUILTING AND FINISHING

1. Layer batting between quilt top and backing.
2. Pin or baste layers together.
3. Model was machine quilted.
4. Add binding, mitering corners.
