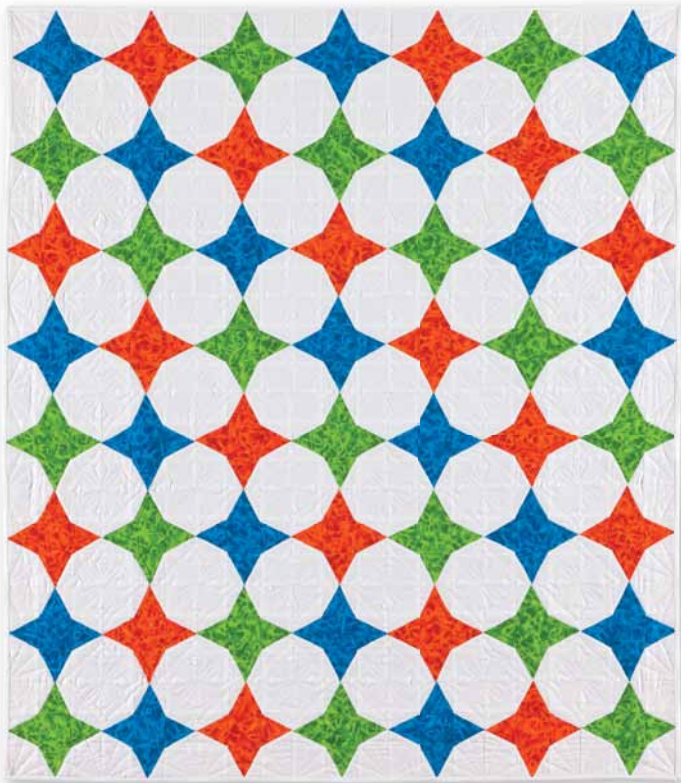


GO! Diamonds in the Sky Quilt

GO!® DIES USED

- GO! Triangles in Square-2" Finished Square (55410)
- GO! Square-2½" (2" Finished Square) (55059 or 55018)
- GO! Strip Cutter-2½" (2" Finished) (55017 or 55014)

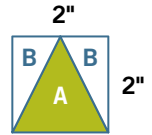
FABRIC REQUIREMENTS

- Fabric 1—4 yards
- Fabric 2—¾ yard
- Fabric 3—¾ yard
- Fabric 4—¾ yards
- Batting—45" x 54"
- Backing—3 yards

CUTTING DIRECTIONS

Fabric 1:

- Cut 224 pairs—"B" side triangles
- Cut 224—2½" squares
- Cut 7—2½" strips x WOF (Set aside for binding)



Fabric 2:

- Cut 76—"A" center triangles
- Cut 19—2½" squares

Fabric 3:

- Cut 76—"A" center triangles
- Cut 19—2½" squares

Fabric 4:

- Cut 76—"A" center triangles
- Cut 19—2½" squares

SEWING DIRECTIONS

1. Lay one "B" side triangle right sides together with one "A" center triangle, so notched points align, and sew.



NOTE: Seam ends at point of "A" center triangle notch, and "B" side triangle point extends just beyond bottom edge of "A" center triangle, as shown.



2. Press towards "B" side triangle.
3. Lay one "B" side triangle on opposite side of "A" center triangle and sew.

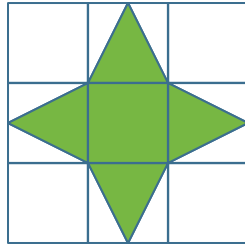


4. Press towards "B" side triangle. Block should measure 2½" x 2½".
5. Make a total of 19 Fabric #2, 2" Triangle in Square (TIS) Units as shown.
6. Repeat previous five steps with two Fabric #1, "B" side triangles and one Fabric #3, "A" center triangle. Make a total of 19 Fabric #3, 2" finished TIS Units. Continue with two Fabric #1, "B" side triangles and one Fabric #4, "A" center triangle. Make a total of 19 Fabric #4, 2" finished TIS Units.
7. Lay out four Fabric #1, 2½" squares; four Fabric #2, 2" finished TIS Units; and one Fabric #2, 2½" squares as shown.



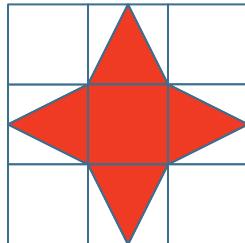
8. Pin and sew blocks into rows. Press seams in opposite directions.

9. Pin and sew rows together. Press seams in opposite directions. Block should measure $6\frac{1}{2}" \times 6\frac{1}{2}"$.
10. Make a total of 19 Unit # 1 blocks.
11. Lay out four Fabric #1, $2\frac{1}{2}"$ squares; four Fabric #3, 2" finished TIS Units; and one Fabric #3, $2\frac{1}{2}"$ square as shown.



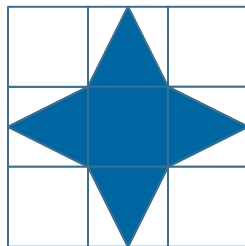
Unit #1

12. Pin and sew blocks into rows. Press seams in opposite directions.
13. Pin and sew rows together. Press seams in opposite directions. Block should measure $6\frac{1}{2}" \times 6\frac{1}{2}"$.
14. Make a total of 19 Unit # 2 blocks.
15. Lay out four Fabric #1, $2\frac{1}{2}"$ squares; four Fabric #4, 2" finished TIS Units; and one Fabric #4, $2\frac{1}{2}"$ square as shown.



Unit #2

16. Pin and sew blocks into rows. Press seams in opposite directions
17. Pin and sew rows together. Press seams in opposite directions. Block should measure $6\frac{1}{2}" \times 6\frac{1}{2}"$.
18. Make a total of 19 Unit # 3 blocks.
19. Lay out blocks alternating colors as shown.



Unit #3

20. Pin and sew blocks into rows. Press seams in opposite directions.
21. Pin and sew rows together. Press seams in the same direction.

QUILTING AND FINISHING

1. Layer quilt top with batting and backing.
2. Pin or baste layers together.
3. Model was custom machine quilted.
4. Add binding, mitering the corners.
