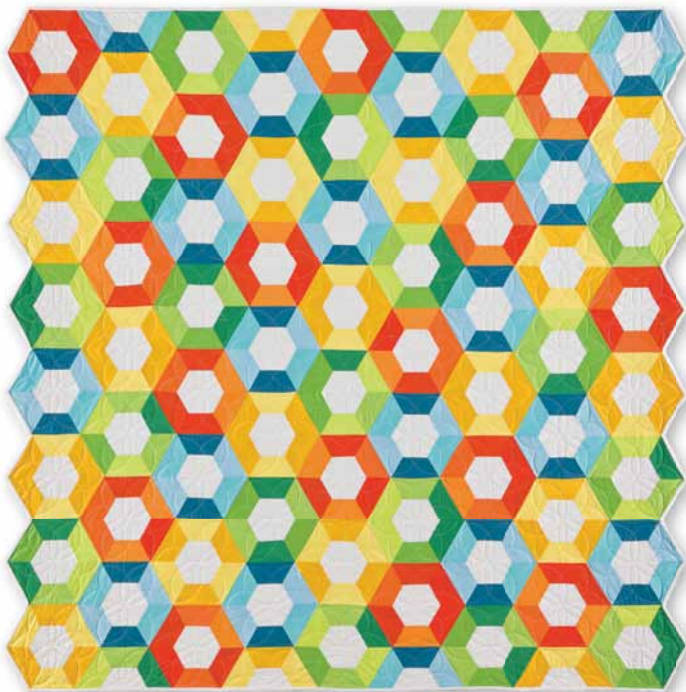


## GO! Morning Glory Blooms Quilt

finished size 64" x 64"



Fabric provided by RJR Fabrics.

### GO!® DIES USED

- GO! Half Hexagon-1", 1½", 2½" Sides (¾", 1¼", 2¼" Finished)
- GO! Strip Cutter-2½" (2" Finished) (55017 or 55014)

### FABRIC REQUIREMENTS

- Fabric 1—1¾ yards
- Fabric 2—1½ yards
- Fabric 3—1½ yards
- Fabric 4—1½ yards
- Fabric 5—1½ yards
- Binding—¾ yards
- Batting—70" x 70"
- Backing—4 yards

### CUTTING DIRECTIONS

#### Fabric 1:

- Cut 11—5½" x width of fabric (WOF) strips  
Sub cut into 144—2½" half hexagons

#### Fabric 2:

- Cut 9—5½" x WOF strips  
Sub cut into 117—2½" half hexagons

#### Fabric 3:

- Cut 7—5½" x WOF strips  
Sub cut into 96—2½" half hexagons

#### Fabric 4:

- Cut 8—5½" x WOF strips  
Sub cut into 108—2½" half hexagons





#### Fabric 5:

- Cut 8—5½" x WOF strips  
Sub cut into 111—2½" half hexagons

#### Binding Fabric:

- Cut 8—2½" x WOF strips

### SEWING DIRECTIONS

1. Lay out one, Fabric #1 half hexagon and three, Fabric #2 half hexagons as shown. 
2. Mark ¼" from the corner (wrong side) on each hexagon where they come together with Fabric #1.
3. Sew one, Fabric #2 half hexagon together with the Fabric #1 half hexagon starting from the outside edge and sewing towards the ¼" mark. Stop when you get to your ¼" mark, backstitch. 
4. Sew the second Fabric #2 half hexagon onto the two sewed in the previous step. Starting on the outside edge, sew to the ¼" mark stop, pivot, lining up fabric edges of the unsewn seam, and sew to the next ¼" mark. 
5. Sew the third half hexagon onto the two sewed in the previous step. Starting on the outside edge, sew to the ¼" mark, stop, pivot, lining up fabric edges of the unsewn seam, and sew to outside edge. 
6. Repeat previous five steps to make a total of 39 pieced half hexagon Unit #1.

7. Repeat previous six steps to make a total of 32, Fabric #3 pieced half hexagon Unit #2; 36, Fabric #4 pieced half hexagon Unit #3; and 37, Fabric #5 pieced half hexagon Unit #4.
8. Lay out Units #1 – #4 into horizontal rows paying attention to color placement. Quilt top should be 9 units across and 16 units long.
9. Sew blocks together into rows. Pressing seams in the same direction.



10. Sew rows together and press seams in the same directions.

## QUILTING AND FINISHING

1. Layer quilt top with batting and backing.
2. Pin or baste layers together.
3. Model was custom machine quilted.
4. Add binding, mitering the corners.
