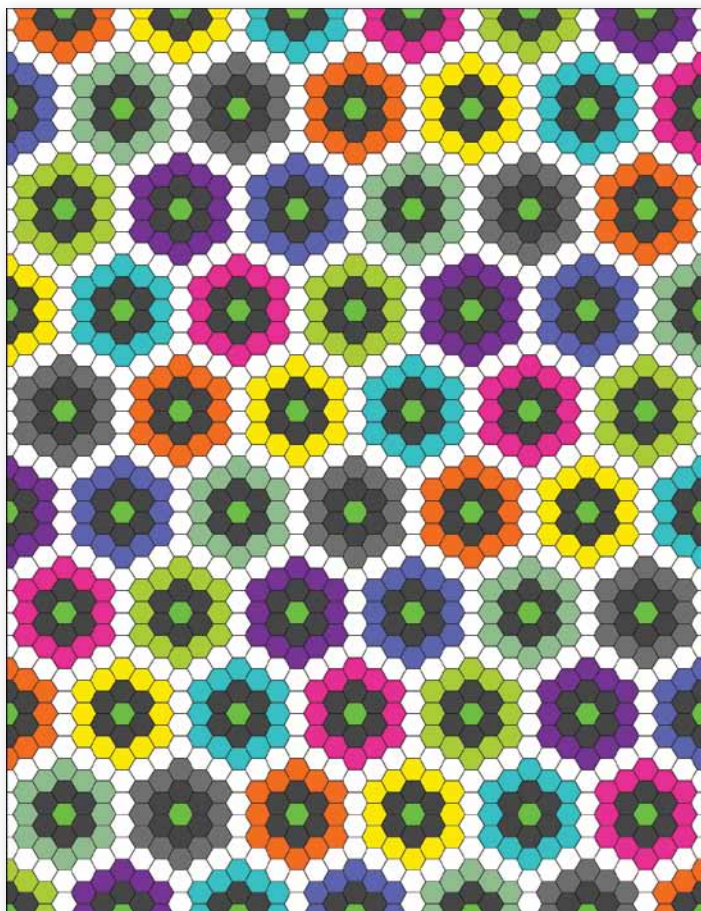


## GO! Urban Flower Garden Quilt

finished size 54½" x 71"



### CUTTING DIRECTIONS

#### Fabric 1:

- Cut 15—6" x width of fabric (WOF) strips  
Sub cut into 456—1" Finished Hexagons

#### Fabric 2:

- Cut 3—6" x WOF strips  
Sub cut into 81—1" Finished Hexagons

#### Fabric 3:

- Cut 3—6" x WOF strips  
Sub cut into 74—1" Finished Hexagons

#### Fabric 4:

- Cut 3—6" x WOF strips  
Sub cut into 69—1" Finished Hexagons

#### Fabric 5:

- Cut 3—6" x WOF strips  
Sub cut into 74—1" Finished Hexagons

#### Fabric 6:

- Cut 3—6" x WOF strips  
Sub cut into 74—1" Finished Hexagons

#### Fabric 7:

- Cut 3—6" x WOF strips  
Sub cut into 69—1" Finished Hexagons

#### Fabric 8:

- Cut 3—6" x WOF strips  
Sub cut into 74—1" Finished Hexagons

#### Fabric 9:

- Cut 3—6" x WOF strips  
Sub cut into 81—1" Finished Hexagons

#### Fabric 10:

- Cut 3—6" x WOF strips  
Sub cut into 79—1" Finished Hexagons

#### Fabric 11:

- Cut 11—6" x WOF strips  
Sub cut into 345—1" Finished Hexagons

#### Fabric 12:

- Cut 3—6" x WOF strips  
Sub cut into 65—1" Finished Hexagons

#### Binding Fabric:

- Cut 8—2½" x WOF strips

#### Cardstock:

- Cut 1,541—small English Paper Piecing templates

### FABRIC REQUIREMENTS

## SEWING DIRECTIONS

1. Pin cardstock to wrong side of fabric leaving ¼" all the way around (Diagram 1).
2. Fold fabric edges over the cardstock and hand baste into place (Diagram 2).
3. Repeat previous two steps with Fabrics #1 through #12 with cardstock templates.
4. Arrange 12, Fabric #2 Hexagons; 6, Fabric #11 Hexagons; and 1, Fabric #12 Hexagon as shown (Diagram 3).
5. Starting with the center, lay two patches right sides together and whip stitch one edge together. Catch just the very edge of the fold of the fabric and not the cardstock template.
6. Whip stitch all the hexagons together to complete one block.
7. Following the previous three steps, making a total of 65, Grandmother's Flower Garden Blocks using 6, Fabric #11 and 1, Fabric #12 in each block (Diagram 4).
  - Fabric #2: 5 Whole Blocks and 3 Half Blocks
  - Fabric #3: 5 Whole Blocks and 2 Half Blocks
  - Fabric #4: 4 Whole Blocks and 3 Half Blocks
  - Fabric #5: 5 Whole Blocks and 2 Half Blocks
  - Fabric #6: 5 Whole Blocks and 2 Half Blocks
  - Fabric #7: 4 Whole Blocks and 3 Half Blocks
  - Fabric #8: 5 Whole Blocks and 2 Half Blocks
  - Fabric #9: 5 Whole Blocks and 3 Half Blocks
  - Fabric #10: 6 Whole Blocks and 1 Half Block
8. Following the picture, lay out the 65 Blocks and the 455 Fabric #1 Hexagons as shown.
9. Sew quilt top together in the same manner as the blocks were made.
10. Remove cardstock templates from quilt top.
11. Trim quilt edges even.

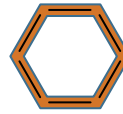

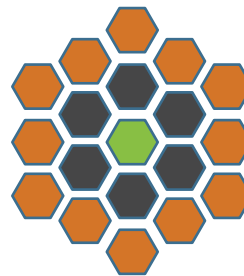

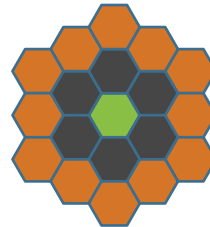

## QUILTING AND FINISHING

1. Layer quilt top with batting and backing.
2. Pin or baste layers together.
3. Model was custom machine quilted.
4. Add binding, mitering the corners.
