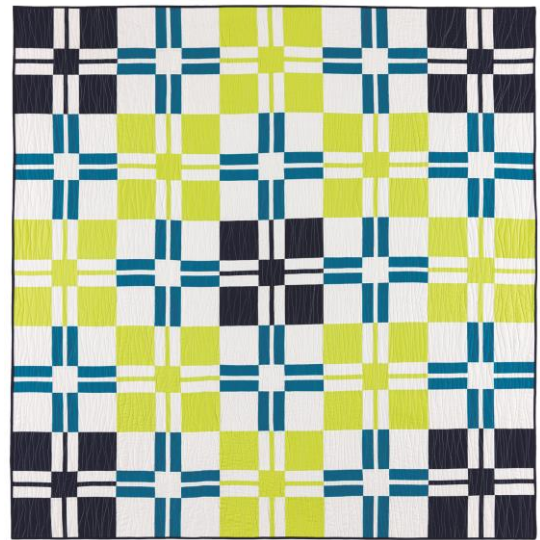














GO! Add It Up Bed Quilt

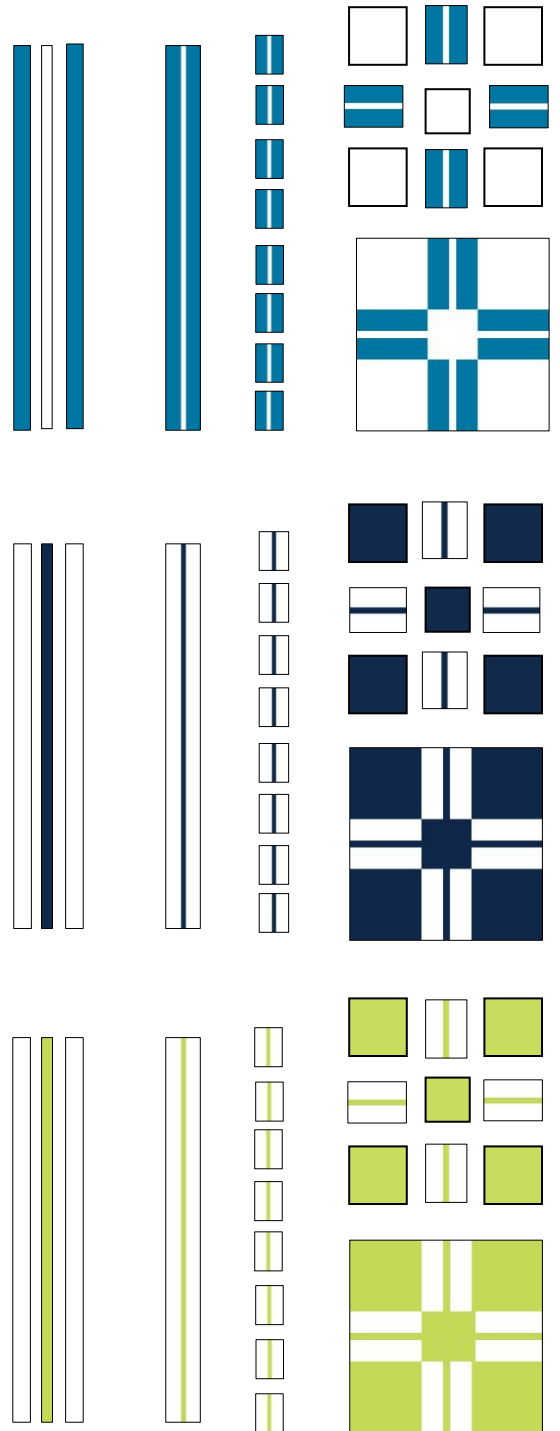

Blue		GO! Strip Cutter-1¾" strip (1¼" Finished) (55083)	Cut 12—1¾" strips	⅔ Yard
Dark Blue		GO! Strip Cutter-1" (½" Finished) (55052 or 55164)	Cut 3—1" strips	1⅓ Yard
Dark Blue		GO! Strip Cutter-2½" (2" Finished) (55017 or 55014)	Cut 7—2½" strips for binding	Yardage included above
Dark Blue		GO! Square-5" (4½" finished) (55010)	Cut 2—10½" x width of fabric (WOF) strips. Fanfold into 5½" widths. Sub cut 20—5" Squares	Yardage included above
Dark Blue		GO! Square-3½" (3" Finished) (55006)	Use leftover 10½" x WOF strips from above. Fanfold into 3—4" widths. Sub cut 5—3½" Squares	Yardage included above
Green		GO! Strip Cutter-1" (½" Finished) (55052 or 55164)	Cut 4—1" x strips	1 Yard
Green		GO! Square-5" (4½" finished) (55010)	Cut 3—10½" x WOF strips. Fanfold into 5½" widths. Sub cut 32—5" Squares	Yardage included above
Green		GO! Square-3½" (3" Finished) (55006)	Use leftover 10½" x WOF strips from above. Fanfold into 4—4" widths. Sub cut 8—3½" Squares	Yardage included above
White		GO! Strip Cutter-1" (½" Finished) (55052 or 55164)	Cut 6—1" strips	2⅞ Yards
White		GO! Strip Cutter-1¾" strip (1¼" Finished) (55083)	Cut 14—1¾" strips	Yardage included above
White		GO! Square-5" (4½" finished) (55010)	Cut 4—10½" x WOF strips. Fanfold into 5½" widths. Sub cut 48—5" Squares	Yardage included above
White		GO! Square-3½" (3" Finished) (55006)	Use leftover 10 ½" x WOF strips from above. Fanfold into 6—4" widths. Sub cut 12—3½" Squares	Yardage included above

Additional Fabrics Needed:

- Backing Fabric—66" x 66"
- Batting—66" x 66"

Sewing Directions

1. Lay out two blue $1\frac{3}{4}$ " strips and one white 1" strip. Pin and sew one blue strip to either side of the white strip. Press seams toward the blue strips. Make six strip sets.
2. Sub cut each strip set into eight 5" sections. You will have 48—5" strips sets.
3. Lay out four white 5" squares, four 5" strip sets, and one white $3\frac{1}{2}$ " square to form one block, as shown.
4. Pin and sew three rows. Press seams toward the blue strip sets.
5. Pin and sew three row units together to form one block. Press seams toward the $3\frac{1}{2}$ " square rows. Make 12 blocks.
6. Lay out two white $1\frac{3}{4}$ " strips and one dark blue 1" strip. Pin and sew one white strip to either side of the dark blue strip. Press seams toward the dark blue strip. Make three strip sets.
7. Sub cut each strip set into eight 5" sections. You will need 20—5" strips sets.
8. Lay out four dark blue 5" squares, four 5" strip sets, and one dark blue $3\frac{1}{2}$ " square to form one block, as shown.
9. Pin and sew three rows. Press seams toward the dark blue squares.
10. Pin and sew three row units together to form one block. Press seams toward the 5" square rows. Make five blocks.
11. Lay out two white $1\frac{3}{4}$ " strips and one green 1" strip. Pin and sew one white strip to either side of the green strip. Press seams toward the green strip. Make four strip sets.
12. Sub cut each strip set into eight 5" sections. You will have 32—5" strips sets.
13. Lay out four green 5" squares, four 5" strip sets, and one green $3\frac{1}{2}$ " square to form one block, as shown.
14. Pin and sew three rows. Press seams toward the green squares.
15. Pin and sew three row units together to form one block. Press seams toward the 5" square rows. Make eight blocks.



16. Lay out blocks in rows of five, using the bed quilt diagram as a guide.
17. Pin and sew five rows, each with five blocks. Press seams toward the dark 5" squares for each row.
18. Pin and sew five row units together. Press seams toward the added rows.



Quilting and Finishing:

1. Layer batting between bed quilt top and backing.
2. Pin or baste layers together.
3. Quilt as desired.
4. Add dark blue fabric binding, mitering corners.
