To make a 6" Block use GO! Qube Mix & Match 6" Block (55775)

- GO! Square-3½" (3" Finished) (Shape 1)
- GO! Half Square Triangle-3" Finished Square (Shape 3)
- GO! Quarter Square Triangle-3" Finished Square (Shape 4)
- GO! Half Square Triangle-1½" Finished Square (Shape 5)
- GO! Square on Point-2⁵/₈" (2¹/₈" Finished) (Shape 6)
- GO! Parallelogram 45° -2¼" x 2¹³/₁₆" Sides (1½" x 2¹/₈" Finished) (Shape 7)

Additional Dies Needed:

- GO! Strip Cutter-2¼" (1¾" Finished) (55053)

Additional Cutting Directions:

- Binding
 - Cut 5—2¼" strips using GO! Strip Cutter-2¼" (1¾" Finished) (55053) for binding

Additional Fabrics Needed:

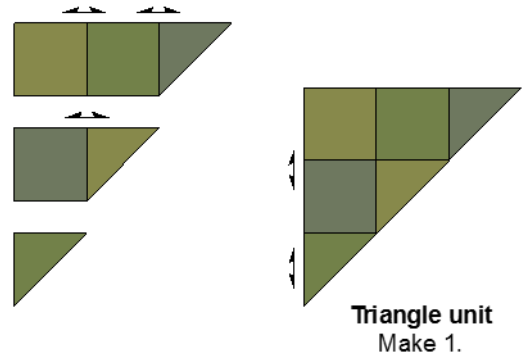
- Binding: Purple Batik or Print—Yardage included above
- Backing: 2½ yards
- Batting: 54" x 54"

Sewing Directions:

Press all seams open and use ¼" seams, unless otherwise indicated.

Make the Blocks

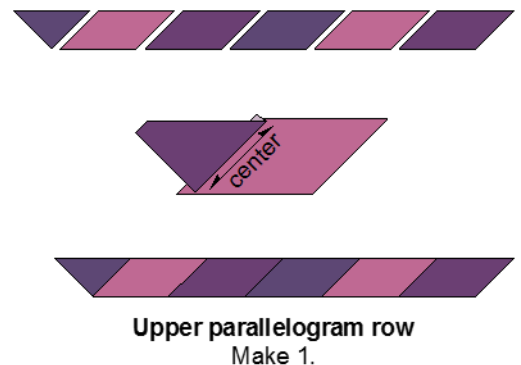
1. Randomly select three large green squares (Shape 1) and three large green HSTs (Shape 3). Arrange the patches into three rows as shown. Sew the patches in the top two rows together along adjacent edges. Press the seams open. Sew the rows together, matching seams, to make a triangle unit. Press the seams open.



2. Select one large cream HST (Shape 3) and two green QSTs (Shape 4). Sew the long edge of one green QST to each short edge of the cream HST to make a flying geese unit. Press the seams away from the large HST. Make 3 flying geese units.



3. Arrange five purple parallelograms (Shape 7) and one purple small HST (Shape 5) in a single row as shown. Pin and sew two parallelograms right sides together along adjacent edges. (You will need to offset the parallelograms by ¼".) Continue with the remaining parallelograms. Sewn parallelogram shapes should form straight even edges. Adjust your seam allowance to a scant ¼" when sewing the parallelograms.

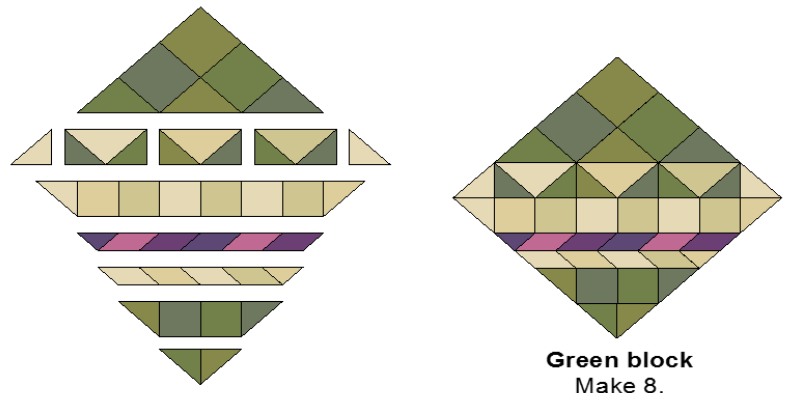


4. Fingerpress the triangle's seam allowance to the wrong side along one short edge. Place the folded edge of the triangle on the right side of the

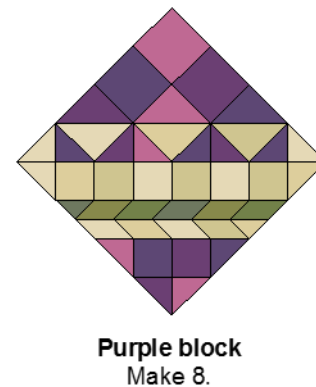


parallelogram, aligning the long edges and seam allowances. If necessary, center the triangle along the parallelogram's edge. Holding the seam allowances together, unfold the triangle and stitch the triangle and parallelogram together, using the fingerpressed crease as a guide. Repeat this step with four cream parallelograms (Shape 7) and one cream HST (Shape 5) to make a second parallelogram row, noting the triangle placement.

5. Arrange the triangle and flying geese units from steps 1 and 2, the two parallelogram rows from step 3, plus six cream and two green squares on point (Shape 6), and four cream and four green QSTs (Shape 4) into seven rows as shown. Join the patches in each row together along adjacent edges. Press the seams open. Join the rows together, matching seams. Press the seams open. Make 8 green blocks.

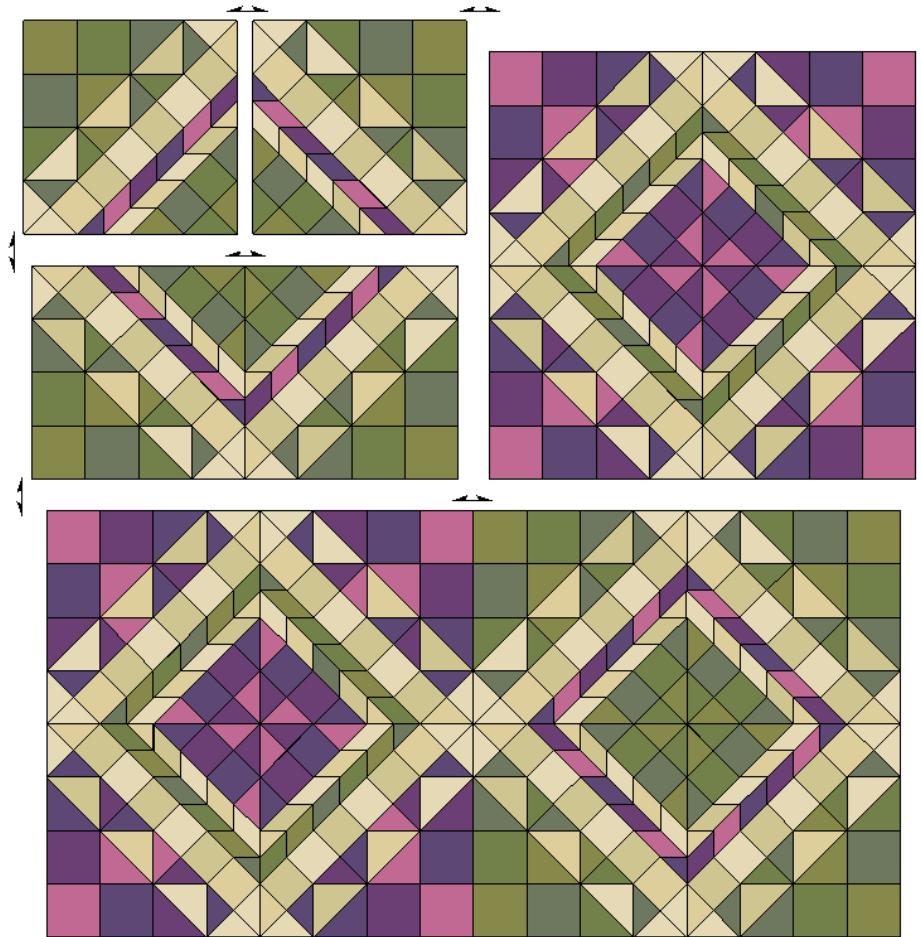


6. Repeat steps 1-5, switching green and purple patches to make 8 purple blocks.



Assemble the Quilt Top

1. Referring to the Quilt Assembly Diagram for color placement and block orientation, arrange four green blocks into two rows of two blocks each. Sew the blocks in each row together, matching seams. Sew the rows together, matching seams. Make two green and two purple four-block units.

2. Arrange the four-block units in two rows of two units each as shown in the Quilt Assembly Diagram. Join the units in each row together along adjacent edges. Press the seams open. Join the rows together along adjacent edges. Press the seam open or in one direction.

Quilting and Finishing:

1. Layer the batting between the quilt top and backing, with the wrong sides facing the batting.
2. Pin or baste layers together.
3. Quilt as desired.

4. Sew the binding strips together along the short ends, using straight or diagonal seams.

Press the strip in half lengthwise, with wrong sides together. Stitch the binding to the quilt front, matching raw edges and mitering corners. Fold the binding to the quilt back, encasing the raw edges. Hand stitch the binding to the quilt back.
